## Week of Christian Unity

This year has been designated by Pope Francis as a year of prayer for and focus on Consecrated Religious life. As part of this year the weekend, 6-8 February, has been set aside within the Cathedral for the many religious orders of men and women working within the Diocese to have stalls and displays, and to talk to visitors and share something of their life with people. On Friday 6<sup>th</sup> February they will be inviting schools to the Cathedral throughout the day from 9.30am until 4pm. Then on Saturday they will be there all day concluding with the evening Vigil Mass at 6.30pm which will take place in the Cathedral rather than the Crypt Chapel that weekend. Archbishop Malcolm will preside at the evening Mass. The displays and stalls will be dismantled following the Solemn Mass on Sunday.

Last week the staff in Cathedral House were busy sending out invites to the Civic Mass which takes place on 15<sup>th</sup> February this year. This always seems to cause consternation and stress trying to get the most up to date lists for the various civic and legal personnel that need to be invited and then dealing with all the e-mails and postage. We probably send out about 1,800 invites for this Mass, most reply to the invites but only a low percentage are actually able to attend. Sadly very few of our Catholic institutions and organisation that are invited make the effort to send representatives. According to our female staff the top of the charming list are the judges and former high sheriffs, but all it needs is an army officer to turn up on the day in full ceremonial uniform and it doesn't matter how charming everyone else has been leading up to the day.

This Sunday is both Peace Sunday and the start of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. Pax Christi will have a stall in the entrance area of the Cathedral with information about their work.

Linked to this there will also be a Prayer Vigil on Friday evening 6<sup>th</sup> February from 7.30pm until 9pm organised by 'Aid to the Church in Need'. Archbishop Malcolm will lead the vigil praying for peace and religious freedom. The National Director, Neville Kyrke-Smith will talk about many of the issues that communities and faith groups are facing in parts of the world at this time.

We begin the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity with a joint service of Evensong at Liverpool Cathedral this afternoon at 3.00pm. Both Cathedral Choirs will be taking part and Fr Liam will preach at the service. If you wish to attend the service please join us at the front of the Cathedral in the benches by the high altar. I enclose a prayer for this week.

*God of life, who calls us to justice and peace,  
May our security come not from arms, but from respect.*

*May our force be not of violence, but of love.*

*May our wealth be not in money, but in sharing.*

*May our unity be not in the quest of power, but in the vulnerable witness to do your will.*

*Open and confident, may we share today and forever, the bread of solidarity, justice and peace.*

*In the name of Jesus, who as a victim of our violence gave forgiveness to us all,  
we pray in the Lords name. Amen.*

## HOPE+ NEWS

We always knew that the people of Liverpool are the most generous in the UK, but even we were astonished at people's generosity over the Advent and Christmas period. People have not only been generous with food, they have dug deep into their pockets and donated cash too. Mission in the Economy (MitE) and their volunteers collected food and cash at the Christmas Crib in Church Street, and a very cold coming they had of it too, but managed to collect an astonishing £2811 for us; Liverpool Chamber of Commerce donated £3000 at their Christmas dinner at the Cathedral, we received £1560 as our share from the collection at Bishop Paul's Enthronement Service, £1000 from the Duchy of Lancaster, and as one of the Cathedral's nominated charities, we will receive £2500+. Just counting the donations of £100 and above, we have received over £13,000 since Advent Sunday, and we have yet to get a final total on the smaller, but equally generous cash donations. We estimate that we have also received at least 17 tons of food, as well as clothes and toiletries. As you will see from our latest newsletter, such generosity could not have arrived at a better time. We outgrew our food store in the garage at Lady Chapel Close some time ago, and recent building work and our continued growth (13,500 and counting) has made moving an urgent

necessity. As a result we need to purchase shelving and storage, and we desperately need a small van.

We do still need your donations please. Between Advent Sunday and Epiphany we provided food for just over 1,000 people. Given the large numbers of people we see each week, the need for regular donations of food, toiletries, nappies, and clothes will continue for some considerable time to come. Please do read our latest newsletter, and perhaps when you've finished with it, pass it on to someone who hasn't heard about our work.

## STEWARDS

We are currently looking for volunteers to join our team of Cathedral Stewards. The main purpose of the role of Steward is to welcome regular members of our congregation and visitors to our services and Mass at the Cathedral. They assist also by taking the collection, with communion arrangements and giving out service sheets and answering all manner of questions and queries. On bigger occasions they would be invaluable showing people to their seats. No experience is needed as full training would be given. All you need is to be able to give the time – mostly on Sundays but there will be some Sunday afternoon services and weekday services when a presence will be required, as well as all the major Feasts such as Easter and Christmas. 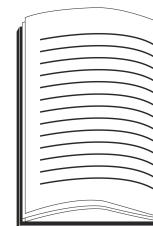
