Bishops Conference

The Bishops Conference of England and Wales has been busy over the post Christmas and New Year period with the announcement of two projects for parishes to engage with over the course of 2015. This week's newsletter provides some information on them both with a view to using some of the discussion materials they have produced for meetings during the weeks of Lent. The first is

'Proclaim '15: BUILDING MISSIONARY PARISHES.'

It is the name of a new national Bishops' initiative being launched in 2015 to support the development of parish evangelisation. It is inspired by Pope Francis' writings and has five parts which include: the provision of free parish small group materials; the organisation of a National Catholic Evangelisation Conference in Birmingham on 11 July 2015 for 850 evangelisation representatives from across England and Wales; an invitation to parishes to host a parish Prayer Vigil on the night of 11 July 2015 with free prayer materials provided; the invitation to dioceses, deaneries and parishes to have their own Proclaim '15 event in autumn 2015; the publication of new evangelisation resources as a fruit of the National Conference to equip local evangelisers. Please do get involved in what is a significant new step in service of the proclamation of the Gospel in our area. More information will be available in our newsletter over the coming months. Cardinal Nichols said at the launch of this project, "This pioneering initiative, inspired by Pope Francis' *Evangelii Gaudium*, is for all clergy, religious and lay people. Why? Because we all share the one mission – to PROCLAIM the joy of the Gospel. The wide range of practical ideas offered for planning and carrying out fruitful parish evangelisation will help us all to be better missionary disciples. Please don't let this opportunity pass you by."

The Second programme of discussions is in relation to the forthcoming Synod in Rome later this year. It is entitled '**An invitation from the Bishops of England and Wales to Reflect on the gift of Marriage and Family Life**'. It provides an opportunity to discuss the various stages of marriage and family life, the challenges and joys, such as the early years, the gift of children and coping with family growing up, alone as a couple and the elderly years. Where does faith fit in to the reality of family life today and how can the church be more supportive of the family? One of the very real challenges to the church is how to communicate the relevance and the value of the Gospel and church teaching for peoples lives today.

How we link all this together for a series in Lent is another question but we won't be short of material to follow.

Next Sunday there will be a retiring collection to support the work of the Catholic Education Council.

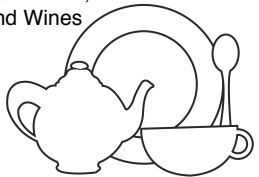

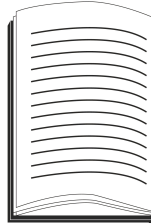
