Civic Sunday

The 'Living Joyfully' events last week seemed to be a great success, not necessarily judged on the vocations it might or might not produce but more on the sense of church that was portrayed. With so many different types of witness and consecrated lives dedicated to service of the Gospel the joy and fellowship amongst all the participants was evident over the three days. The Carmelite Community at Maryton in Allerton had a wonderful short video portrayal of their life which had been filmed at the new convent and the prayerful, calm serenity of the enclosed religious life was well represented alongside the teaching, nursing and missionary orders.

This Sunday we extend a warm welcome to all our guests who are attending the Annual Civic Mass at 11.00am. We are expecting there to be representatives from all walks of public and Church life from across our region as we pray for our local communities and their needs and all those in positions of authority in public life. The weather forecast is predicting rain for Sunday – I hope that won't adversely affect the processions and the wearing of ceremonial robes which add colour and a bit of necessary pomp to the occasion.

The season of Lent begins this week with the Distribution of Ashes on Wednesday. Based on previous experience we expect large crowds for Masses on this day hence the 5.15pm Mass will be celebrated in the main Cathedral and there will be an addition to our normal scheduled Mass times — a later service at 7.30pm in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel. Even in our high tech world, the stark symbol of ashes, remains a striking reminder of our mortality and our need for God. During Lent we will hold a series of four evening talks on the Wednesdays in March on different forms of prayer. There are also Lenten Talks and events taking place at Liverpool Cathedral, the

Pauline Bookshop and the parish church of Our Lady and St Nicholas involving Archbishop Malcolm and the Bishop of Liverpool. Please see the notice boards for details of Lenten events.

One of the sad facts of church life in recent years is that we have had to cope with declining church attendance and decreasing numbers of clergy and religious. Sadly the Carmelite Community at Eccleston, St Helens, is due to close shortly and due to the age and infirmity of a number of the sisters they will all be moving to different religious houses. They have been a constant source of prayer in our Diocese for many years please remember them in your prayers at what is a traumatic time for them. They have kindly donated a thurible and sanctuary bell for our Crypt Chapel and kind parishioners have had these re-gilded along with the sanctuary lamp at St Vincent's in memory of their community.

Thinking back over the years one of the most fruitful Lenten activities were the Friday lunches. Over a simple bowl of soup and a piece of bread social and church issues were discussed and speakers talked on a whole variety of topics. I think it would be a good thing if we could reintroduce this for Lent this year in a small way with a simple lunch time gathering at 1.00pm in the Gibberd Room for those who wished and over a bowl of soup we could read and have a brief discussion on the forthcoming Sunday readings for that week of Lent - quaranteed to finish by 1.45pm. If you would be interested in coming along perhaps you could let me know to get some idea of what sort of interest there might be with a view to starting on Friday 27th February.
