Letters all round

It wasn't just the Anglican Bishops that issued a letter to their parishes across the country, regarding the general Election in May, this week. Our own Catholic Bishops have also issued a letter in a similar way to Catholics in England and Wales and so far it has caused less of a stir from the press and politicians than the one for Anglicans. This is available at the back of the Cathedral and Crypt with the newsletters and Pastoral Letters this weekend.

In the introduction the letter states 'At this General Election we are asked to think about the kind of society that we want here at home and abroad. Whom you vote for is a matter for you alone. Our aim is to suggest how you might approach this important question in May 2015 and to suggest some key issues for your reflection as you make your own decision.' The issues the Bishops want us to reflect on are respect for life, supporting family life and alleviating poverty, education, building communities and caring for the wider world.'

The letter ends with these words. 'Politics is a vital and necessary vocation. It carries important responsibilities not only for policy decisions but also for shaping the hopes and aspirations of people. Political leaders can choose to appeal to our sense of hope or of fear, to our desires to care for others or for ourselves, and to our sense of solidarity or of selfishness. We expect politicians to be committed to the common good. We also each have a responsibility to be involved in the democratic process. It is important that we vote. It is a duty which springs from the privilege of living in a democratic society. In deciding how we vote the question for each one of us is then: How, in the light of the Gospel, can my vote best serve the common good?' Please take a leaflet.

There is a Pastoral Letter for the First Sunday of Lent from Archbishop Malcolm to be read at all Masses this weekend. He encourages us to make our Lenten journey focussing on the three disciplines of prayer, fasting and almsgiving that we heard proclaimed in the Gospel for Ash Wednesday. Here is a passage from the letter referring to fasting.

'Jesus reminds us that we are to fast. I hope that we have all 'given up something for Lent'. However, the Lenten fast is not a diet, but is much more profound than that – it expresses our longing for God and helps us identify with the poor, including those in our midst. So, I would like to suggest, this Lent, that we fast from something else in addition to giving up some food or drink that we like for a few weeks so that we can become a little poorer. Maybe those of us who drive to work could walk for part of the journey; we could fast from a favourite TV programme or the internet, spending the time instead with our families or friends. Our fasting should be a hunger for justice, a thirst for doing what is right, so that Christ shines through our words, deeds and the example that we set others by our way of living.'

This Sunday afternoon there is the Rite of Election Service at 3.00pm at which the Archbishop welcomes all those adults from across the Diocese who are in their final stages of preparation to be received into the church at Easter. We have nine candidates from the Cathedral parish. Next Friday is family Fast day - there will be a retiring collection next weekend in support of Cafod.
