Lenten temptations

It's always a mad scramble amongst Cathedral staff about this time of year to squeeze in the remnants of this year's holiday entitlement before the end of March, and with Fr Ged and the Dean also getting a well deserved break - not sure if this is post Christmas break or pre Easter - one but either way it appears to me holding the fort at the moment!

With lots of social activities taking place in the Cathedral over the next couple of weeks it is going to be very hard not to be tempted to give up my Lenten resolution at just two weeks into the season. On Tuesday evening there is a Wine Society event taking place in the Crypt entitled, 'The Rudiments of Bordeaux'. Do you remember Basil Fawlty, the cynical hotel owner from Fawlty Towers saying, 'I can certainly see that you know your wine. Most of the quests who stay here wouldn't know the difference between Bordeaux and Claret!' During the evening the experts will be getting to grips with the rudiments of Bordeaux and explaining why the wines of the left bank taste different to those of the right and the difference a vintage can make to the wine. Usually my only concern is 'Do I like it?', followed closely by 'Who's paying?'

We are also hosting an evening to celebrate St Patrick's Day on Tuesday 17 March from 7.00pm in the Gibberd Room. The date of this great Saint always falls in Lent, but on St Patrick's Day the prohibitions against eating meat were lifted, and the Irish would celebrate their patron saint with dancing, drinking and feasting on the traditional meal of bacon and cabbage. I can promise the dancing (and singing), drinking and feasting but I am not sure of the menu yet, though it will be traditional Irish fayre. Either way it promises to be a real fun evening and you can get your tickets from Cathedral House. They are only £10! If you can get yourself a better deal do let me know

To more perhaps significant issues: we are having a retiring collection at all Masses this weekend to support the work of CAFOD. This Lent CAFOD is asking us to consider our neighbours. Not those that are sitting next to us. or those that live next door. We are being asked to think about our global neighbours. As neighbours we should share in each other's hopes and fears and are called to respond compassionately to lift each other's burdens and make our hopes a reality. This Lent, the generosity of the Catholic community is being recognised by the Government and they will match pound for pound every donation that is given to CAFOD up to a total of £5 million. So please do give what you can afford to donate in the collection. This is a unique opportunity for us to make a difference and to help our neighbours.

We also have the first of our Lenten Talks on Wednesday evening, 4 March, in the Gibberd Room starting at 7.00pm which will be led by Fr Ged. Details of the subject matter can be found elsewhere in the newsletter but you are encouraged to come as part of your spiritual Lenten iourney.

Liverpool Parish Church is known for many things and foremost amongst them is the Lenten Talks. They go back to the first half of the 20th century and have been seen as a gift to the City to entertain, provoke and inspire. In previous years they have been at lunchtime but this year they are at 6.00pm on Thursday evenings. Next Thursday, 5 March, our very own Archbishop will give the talk. This will be the first time he has spoken at the Church so it would be nice if it were full! There is no charge and you don't have to book for either talk - just turn up!
