# **Holy Week**

With the Antiques Roadshow from the Crypt showing last week and this coming Sunday evening and a live BBC Broadcast of Evening Prayer last Wednesday the Cathedral has had a lot of media coverage over the last seven days. The images of the Cathedral and Crypt on last Sunday's evening programme really showed the best qualities of our buildings and the comment by Fiona Bruce when closing the programme that it was one of the most unusual and best venues that they had visited in the history of the show was good to hear. The whole BBC team were genuinely grateful at the time and the welcome and help they received from the staff and volunteers who took part in the lead up to the programme and on the day. Just as welcome were the comments following the Radio Broadcast of Evening Prayer on the Feast of the Annunciation. There were numerous positive comments about the wonderful music and singing and the sense of prayer 'it was a proper act of worship - not something put on for the radio' commented one person. Thanks and well done to all who took part.

Despite all the media attention the whole focus of Cathedral life now needs to be centred on the worthy celebrations of Holy Week beginning this Sunday with the Blessing of Palms and the Reading of St Mark's Passion at all of our weekend masses. Hopefully the weather will be favourable enough for us to begin the 10.00am and 11.00am celebrations outside - if not we will have to resort to plan B! Archbishop Malcolm will be presiding at the Solemn Mass on Palm Sunday and at all the major services during Holy Week. There will be a special Palm Sunday sung Service of Tenebrae at 7.30pm in the main Cathedral. This will replace the normal afternoon service of Choral Evening Prayer. On Monday and Tuesday of Holy Week there will be Stations of the Cross after the 12.15pm Mass.

The Mass of Chrism will be celebrated on Wednesday evening at 7.30pm (there will not be mass at 5.15pm that evening). This is the occasion when the Archbishop invites the priests and people from across the Diocese to come together in his cathedral for the blessing of the Sacramental Oils to be used throughout the year in every parish and also for the priests to renew their vows. This is one of the occasions in the year when the cathedral will be full to capacity.

For the three mornings of the Triduum the Office of Readings and Morning Prayer is sung each day at 10.00am in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel. The psalms and readings can really help us to deepen our appreciation of what we celebrate on these days and prepare us for the afternoon or evening liturgies. All are welcome to attend. Following this on Good Friday Bishop Williams will lead a Way of the Cross at 11.30am.

On Maundy Thursday the Commemoration of the Lord's Supper is at 7.30pm and following this there will be watching in the Cathedral until 10.30pm. The Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday is at 3.00pm with the singing of St John's Passion, Veneration of the Cross and Holy Communion. Our Easter Vigils will begin at St Vincent's at 8.00pm and the Cathedral Vigil begins at 9.00pm. During this Archbishop Malcolm will baptise three adults and receive a number of others into full communion with the Church.
