Raphael Seitz RIP

Last weekend we heard of the sudden death of the glass artist Raphael Seitz, 57 years old. He was the German artist who designed the external glass columns marking the four gateway approaches to our Cathedral, the Altar Cross, Ambo and Candlesticks within the Blessed Sacrament Chapel the Metropolitan Crozier and the glass Corona in Hope University Chapel. During the time he spent here we had become good friends and it was both a shock and a sadness to hear of his sudden death. He had just returned from Rome where he had visited Pope Francis to present him with an Ecumenical Cross for Buenos Aires in Argentina and was due over in Liverpool to give a lecture at Hope University this week. He was internationally recognised as a 'master of colour and light' and his glass designs, though mainly for churches, can also be seen in buildings ranging from international Airports to Civic and Community Buildings across a number of European countries and even in Asia. As an artist he had a number of national exhibitions of his paintings and drawings and even designs for vestments.

Raphael was a deeply religious person and his design of an ecumenical cross expressed his hope for reconciliation and peace across divided communities and cultures. Here is a quote from him written as the final statement from a book cataloguing his work. *'I have another dream that I would like to transform into art. To create a Utopian space, a light space for people of all religions, for faithful and non faithful alike, a place that gives them dignity. A space in which it is easier to have good thoughts than bad. A light space that encourages work for peace and coexistence amongst all cultures. This is associated with a dream that exists beyond art and time that our colours and brightness are taken up in a light that cannot ultimately be overcome by darkness.'*

The hope I have is the deepest human hope that causes us to paint pictures, as Leonardo Da Vinci put into words, 'That no being ends up as nothing'. May he rest in peace.

This Sunday we welcome members of the Catenian Association who are in Liverpool for a conference and who will be joining us for Solemn Mass at 11.00am – Bishop Williams will be presiding at this Mass.

On Thursday evening the Cathedral Friends have invited Lord David Alton to give a talk with slides outlining the oppression and persecution faced by Christians and church communities in certain countries and regions of the world. Lord Alton has travelled extensively and has a vast experience of the political and cultural situations and it is an issue that is dear to his heart so I'm sure it will be a very interesting and informative evening.

On Wednesday evening we continue with our Lenten talks on prayer -this week's talk is on the theme of Scriptural Prayer.

St Vincent's Church has for a number of years had a temporary wooden altar and lectern located in front of the altar rails. We have recently received wooden altars from Stonyhurst College and from the Carmel Priory at Eccleston. Over the next few weeks I would like to replace the existing movable sanctuary furniture to see if either of these other items may be a more suitable fit for a building of this age and beauty. I don't think that we will need to have a formal parish consultation about this – I'm sure St Vincent's parishioners won't be shy in letting me know their opinions and preferences.

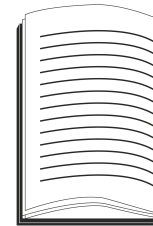
