Vocations Sunday

Following the Antiques Roadshow I have received lots of interest, and some varied correspondence regarding the ancient chest from the Crypt that was included in the second programme. Most of the comments were not that helpful. One chap thought that we had hidden it from Henry VIII and that is why it was enclosed behind a bricked wall – the fact that the Crypt was built some four hundred years after said monarch didn't seem to have been taken into consideration! Also the flippant comment by one of the experts on the show that it could be the 'Ark of the Covenant' didn't help. A few Indiana Jones fans were wanting to come for a closer inspection. There was however one helpful piece of correspondence from a PhD student who was researching period furniture. He thought that the inner chest was probably from 16th Century and the image of Our Lady inside the chest was painted in a Spanish style. As I had thought, he agreed that the references to St Januarius and a number of popes on the front fascia seem to indicate that it started life in Naples, Italy and that would explain the later ornate Italian exterior decoration but how it ended up in Liverpool, and how it had been used over the centuries, is still a mystery. I was really hoping that some wealthy viewer might have offered to pay for its restoration so that it could be displayed in all its former glory but most of my thoughts these days are just wishful thinking.

Pope Francis recently announced a 'Holy Year of Mercy' which will start on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception in December. He has requested that Cathedrals assign a door as the pilgrim door for the Holy Year so that we all make a journey of reconciliation and forgiveness during the course of the year.

Following a meeting last week we hope to have completed the refurbishment work on the East and West Doors of the Cathedral by late Autumn so at least we will be able to name one of these the 'Holy Door' then all we will need will be the pilgrims to come flocking through it!

This Sunday is Good Shepherd Sunday- a day of prayer for Vocations. With regard to priesthood and consecrated life - at present within the Archdiocese we have 150 secular priests in active ministry with over 60 retired. There was nearly three times that number of secular priests working in parishes when I was first ordained! This is likely to reduce significantly in the next few years. The number of religious men and women working within the Diocese has reduced at an even more rapid rate and we have witnessed the closure of convents and religious houses due to lack of personnel. There are signs of renewed interest in young people pursuing a vocation to religious life and priesthood - we pray for the Holy Spirit to guide the church especially to refresh and enliven the faith in family and parish life.

Loving and generous God, it is you who call us by name and ask us to follow you. Help us to grow in the love and service of our church as we experience it today. Give us the energy and courage of your Spirit to shape its future. Grant us faith filled leaders who will embrace Christ's Mission of love and justice. Bless the church in our Diocese by raising up dedicated and generous leaders from our families and friends who will serve your people as sisters, priests, brothers, deacons and lay ministers. Inspire us to know you better and open our hearts to hear your call. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

Our new Food Store is almost ready for use. We have a very large amount of space, and thanks to a grant from the Duchy of Lancaster, some excellent new racking. Sadly we need to keep this store as full as possible, and especially in the coming months. In our first year of operation we provided 5,000 food hampers, in our second just short of 10,000; and the need continues to grow. Based on our last two summers, we will be at our busiest between July and the end of September, especially with the extra strain placed on families by the long vacation. We will also receive our fewest donations. Quite simply, people go on holiday, schools and colleges break up, people are saving for their well earned break.

Each year we have struggled with this problem, and frankly some weeks we have come up short; even to the extent of having to turn people away when we have run out of food. This is

not only distressing for our guests, but it is also very stressful for our volunteers. We want to try and avoid this happening this year. We would ask that if at all possible you make an extra donation/s of food, toiletries, cash in each of the next three months (and through the summer too if you are able). Hopefully our new shelves will soon be groaning as a result of your generosity, and more importantly, we will have enough for everyone who needs us.
