Feast of the Ascension

Here at the Cathedral we are hardly ever without the sound of drills and repair work of some form or other somewhere within our site but at present it is right within the hub of Cathedral House and coping with the noise and the inconvenience associated with parts of the house being no go areas is testing the patience and forbearance of clergy and staff. Thankfully I missed the worst of the noise the week I was away and the majority of the house work will be over within the next few weeks. All of this has come about following the departure of the 'Daughters of Charity' and the changes regarding the Cathedral Convent building. You will read on the other side of the newsletter that two professed members of the Chemin Neuf religious Community will be coming to live in the convent and they will provide accommodation for up to 8/9 University students to live in a Christian community setting. This has meant that we have had to re-house the Cathedral laundry and some other facilities within Cathedral House (which has meant considerable alterations to kitchen etc) with slight adaptations to both buildings for this change of use.

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Ascension of the Lord and we are reminded of the mandate that Christ gave to his church to be His 'witnesses to the ends of the world and to make disciples of all the nations'. The recently exhibited sculpture of 'Christ Proffering the Cross' by Alan Jones in the Unity Chapel is a tangible reminder of the call of the church to witness and serve. In the artist's own words he describes it thus, "The sculpture represents Christ after the Resurrection and shows him proffering the cross. I have created this modern image of Christ as a symbol of peace and reconciliation and hope it reignites peoples faith in God, returning them to their place of worship." The artist claims that it is unique in that it is the only image of Christ of its kind and he would like

it to find its destiny in a 'house of God'.

I would be interested to hear your views as to whether you think it would be an appropriate and suitable quality sculpture to remain more permanently within our Cathedral.

Next Thursday the Historic Churches Committees from across England and Wales will be holding their Annual Conference here for the first time. About 130 people are expected ranging from architects and planners to archivists and conservationists. The theme of the Conference is on 20th Century Catholic Churches and related matters of design and repair. There will also be a special feature on the work of John Piper, particularly the Lantern of our Cathedral. I'm hoping it will provide us with an opportunity to pick experts' brains on the condition of similar examples of this type of work in other churches such as Buckfast, Clifton and Woodthorpe. The type of glass work in our Cathedral involves thick chunks of coloured glass set in a resin matrix, known as Dalle De Verre, and it was used in design of church buildings particularly in 1960/70s. There may be some hidden wisdom out there regarding the best method of repair. Anyway, I hope the Conference is a success and those attending return to their prospective Dioceses with a positive experience of our Cathedral.

Archbishop Malcolm will preside at Solemn Mass next week, Pentecost Sunday, and will confer the Sacrament of Confirmation on young children from our two parishes. Not only is it our Cathedral Feast day but this year is also the Thirtieth Anniversary of the signing of the Covenant of Unity between the Christian Denominations on Merseyside. The Church Leaders will join us for Choral Evening Prayer at 3pm next week when they will renew their commitment to this Covenant.

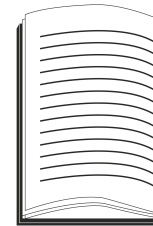
