Corpus Christi

This time of the year is traditionally the period when clergy moves are announced and after a few years of a stable team of priests at the Cathedral we will be involved in a change of personnel this year. Fr Liam has been asked to move to St Julies in Eccleston, St Helens. He will be the assistant priest in the joint parishes of St Julies' and St Teresa's and also helping out within the wider St Helens Deanery. Fr Liam has been with us for the last three years ministering in the Royal and Broadgreen Hospitals, St Vincent's School and our two parishes. We will miss him. He will be replaced by Rev Stephen Lee who is a deacon at present but is due to be ordained a priest in July at St Marie's, Standish, his home parish. We look forward to welcoming him to the Cathedral after his ordination. These moves are due to take place for the beginning of September.

Last Wednesday Archbishop Malcolm and myself set off along Hope Street to the post box at the corner of Canning Street for the unveiling of the plaque depicting the Royal Mail Stamp of our Cathedral from 1968/69. Due to a miscommunication, we ended up standing there looking very suspicious expecting cameramen and a Postman Pat lookalike to turn up but nothing stirred. Eventually we gave up waiting and walked back to the Cathedral only to see activity in the distance at the box on the corner of Oxford and Mulberry Streets. As it turned out this is the nearest location to the Cathedral and the plaque and the Archbishop were duly united and photographed - the confusion had been a result of the central office presuming that we were Liverpool Cathedral and hence choosing a location near to them. Thankfully it is our local Royal Mail depot that handles the delivery of the post!

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi a day when we give thanks especially for Christ's gift to us of the Holy Eucharist. The Collect or Opening Prayer of the Mass for this day sums up the importance of this Feast for us. *'O God, who in this wonderful Sacrament have left us a memorial of your Passion, grant us, so to revere the mysteries of your Body and Blood that we may always experience the fruits of your redemption.'*

Please note that the first Mass on Sunday morning is at the earlier time of 8.10am and is being broadcast live for the Morning Worship on BBC radio four and that Choral Evening Prayer at 3pm concludes with Benediction in honour of the Feast.

The Union of Catholic Mothers hold their Annual Diocesan Mass this Wednesday at 7.30pm. Bishop Williams will preside at this and also for the Mass for New Catholics on Thursday evening at 7pm - a chance for all who were received into the Catholic Church within the Diocese at Easter to meet together and give thanks.

Friday is the Feast of the Sacred Heart and Archbishop Malcolm will celebrate Mass that evening with all those priests celebrating Jubilees this year. This year there are four silver, three Ruby, seven Golden, five Diamond and three Platinum - though I'm not sure if any of the final group will be able to be able to make it to the Mass. Bishop Malone is a Diamond Jubilarian this year and Fr Ian McParland a Silver Jubilarian. Ad Multos Annos.
