'Strangers to Parishioners'

I read an article in the Tablet a few months ago entitled 'From strangers to parishioners' and the importance of it has been brought home to me in experiences in other parishes that I have visited recently. I thought I would use the Record this week to share part of it with you as food for thought.

'The whole community, not just the priest or those officially designated has a responsibility to welcome newcomers to church. There are simple but important ways of including people so they feel they belong.

Parishes from time to time must ask themselves how welcoming they are, how the newcomer feels when they enter our churches for the first time. It is not easy to know this once we are established in a parish but we can reflect upon our own experience of visiting a new parish – did anyone make us feel welcome or ask us if we were just visiting or new to the parish. The next question, naturally, is to ask who should be doing the welcoming. It is very easy to think it is someone else's job. The priest has a special role, so too there needs to be people designated to greet people and give out a service sheet, but the job of welcoming people is actually everyone's job.

In some parishes there is a welcome pack or leaflet for new parishioners with some useful information re service times, schools etc, whether by announcement or personal conversation visitors and anyone new is informed that the priest would be happy to meet them after mass. There are even examples of parishes having a welcome desk with a friendly face to speak to people and respond to any enquiries or pass on information before and after Mass.

Parishes must be places of outreach and welcome, places that give witness to the love of God, through our simple attempts to reflect that love. When people come into your church, it makes all the difference if someone welcomes them, or hands them a copy of the parish newsletter or a hymn book with a word and a smile.

We are called to be welcoming communities that grow into witnessing communities. The way in which the whole community embraces the responsibility to welcome the stranger will develop into the whole community witnessing to the way in which it fulfils the Lord's commendation "I was a stranger and you welcomed me".

I think this offers us some food for thought to reflect upon the way we welcome visitors and newcomers to Masses here at the Cathedral and St Vincent's, and to inform them of the community they are coming to. It is of course something that we do on a daily basis as we have a wonderful Guild of Guides, but it is important for families and individuals who come to our Masses to feel part of our family. To this end if you would be interested in meeting as a group to discuss best practice and the possibility of putting together a welcome pack/leaflet then please contact my Assistant, Claire, to express your interest and to put forward any ideas you might have and then we will organise a get together to put together our ideas and thoughts. This will be for anyone who attends any of our Masses – here or St Vincent's. I do hope you will consider it.

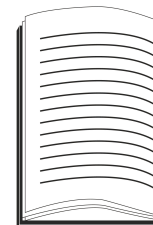
