Graduation Week

Pilgrims will be travelling to Lourdes this week for the Liverpool Diocesan Pilgrimage which starts next Friday. The Annual departure Mass for the Pilgrimage will be celebrated this Sunday at 3pm at the Cathedral with Bishop Williams presiding. Whether we are at home or a pilgrim in Lourdes it is a time when we remember and pray for loved ones and people across the Diocese who may be in hospital or at home who are seriously ill. I include one of the Lourdes official Diocesan Prayers below.

Next Monday the Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, will be in Liverpool making a flying visit. He will be here principally to deliver the Roscoe Lecture at St George's Hall entitled 'Belief and non belief – Learning to live together and with tolerance.' He will also receive an Honorary Degree from John Moores University. Before this on Monday afternoon at a much more informal gathering he will open the new store for the Hope Plus Food Bank at St James House, next to Liverpool Cathedral. I'm sure he will be delighted to be visiting one of his former haunts and hearing of the recent developments that have taken place at both Cathedrals.

Both the Crypt and Cathedral will be busy this week with Graduations. Although Liverpool University are holding their Graduations at the Philharmonic there are daily departmental receptions here in the Concert and Crypt Halls all week. Hope University Graduation Ceremonies will take place in the main Cathedral from 3pm until 4.30pm on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday so the Cathedral will be closed to the public from 1pm and open in good time for evening mass on each of these days. The various activities in the building will mean that the 12.15pm Mass will be celebrated in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel on Monday and Wednesday.

Hopefully with the school holidays underway and the graduation season over we should have a

few weeks of relative calm in terms of extra events at the Cathedral. This should mean that there will finally be some time to catch up and deal with matters that have been put on hold pending an appropriate opportunity and also to turn our attention to plans for the future – at least that is the theory! One consequence will be that the shredder will be working overtime. The downside of the holidays mean an increase of skateboarding and climbers and gangs of marauding trick cyclists. It would be easier to turn a blind eye to their presence except for the damage that they can inflict to the external fabric as well as give us considerable safety concerns whilst on our property.

The Blessed sacrament Shrine will be holding a week long Novena in honour St Peter Eymard rom 24th-1st August. More details of this on the noticeboards.
