# Food that will last

Having watched a few of the final evening highlights of the Tour De France last week I thought I would dig out my old racing cycle and do a bit more exercise. It had been almost ten vears since I had last been out on it and with all the wet weather last week I ended up stripping it down and giving it a bit of a clean and a service instead. The bike itself is about 40 years old and dates back to a time when there was a considerable number of artisan frame builders around Mersevside. The shop that was nearest to our family home as a child was Harry Quinns on Walton Road and whenever I had to go on an errand to the shops I would always stop there and look longingly at the bikes that were in the shop. At the time I had to share an old auntie's bike with five other siblings. I was determined that one day I would own a Harry Quinn Bike! Much later I did manage to purchase a second hand bike frame from him at the time that the business was going into liquidation and after a re-spray the bike was built over about 12 months with parts from various other bike shops such as Walvale, Keith Coppell and Pete Matthews (all have now gone sadly!). I have had it ever since and it is in great shape considering all the miles that it has covered in former years - for the first five years as a priest it was my only mode of transport.

At a time when there is so much change, especially in high tech items, when things can be quickly discarded or become out of date, it is comforting to have a few things that are made to last a lifetime and have that sense of individuality rather than being mass produced. I probably have too many but that is another story! The danger with this fast turnaround culture in faith terms is that our attitude to the sacraments and living out our faith can become 'only on demand' turning to it when needed and then discarding it

the rest of the time. In this week's Gospel the Lord challenges us to work for 'Food that will last'. Just like the Israelites wandering in the desert we can fall away or complain that things haven't turned out the way we thought they should and blame God or the church. So many want the sacraments, the instant food and celebration, without accepting the journey of faith the long term food of a relationship with Christ - the real gift that is offered. The crowd in the Gospel had their immediate hunger satisfied. the immediate need had been responded to and they had been fed but the Lord had so much more to give them and this was the lasting food he wanted them to work for. The bread of immediate need has a sell by date, it satisfies only briefly but the bread of the Lord is a journey of faith leading to eternal life. Our faith in Christ is our greatest lifelong possession, not to be dug out and serviced every ten years like an old cherished bike, but to be treasured, used and lived out.

May the Eucharist, the living word that we regularly receive be such a natural and regular source of spiritual food for us that it not only sustains us in our present life but becomes a promise of greater glory to come.
