Deans' Conference

This week, on Monday, we welcome 16 of the 22 Catholic Cathedral Deans of England and Wales for their annual conference which takes place here this year. I'm not sure what to expect as there will be a considerable number of new faces at this year's gathering but no doubt we will all get along fine. As well as spending time at our Cathedral for services and meetings we will be attending Evensong at Liverpool Cathedral and having some discussions with Dean Pete and also visiting the Town Hall for a meeting with the Lord Mayor. There will be an additional Choral Evening Prayer at 5.45pm on Monday evening and Mass at 9.30am on Tuesday morning to fit in with the Deans' meeting arrangements. The major theme of our discussions relates to the unique opportunities that our Cathedrals have for evangelisation and how we can make the most of the opportunities that arise as a result of the great numbers of visitors that come through our doors and as the 'shop fronts' of the catholic church in this country. I still have some last minute preparations to do not least making sure that we have a good supply of chocolate biscuits at meetings and ample wine for the evening meal to keep everyone happy.

Following a request from the Archbishop of Prague, Cardinal Duka, (who was previously a Dominican Provincial and friend of Archbishop Malcolm), we now have a priest from his Diocese living at the Cathedral until June next year. He is Monsignor Artur Matuszek and was the former rector of the diocesan seminary but is now on sabbatical before a new appointment next year. One of the reasons for choosing to spend time here is to be able to improve his English and gain some experience of the Catholic Church in this country. At present he is busy swatting up on the pronunciation of the order of Mass but he wondered if there was anyone who could spare

an hour or two a week, preferably with some teaching experience who could help him with his conversational English. Please contact Claire in Cathedral House if you think you may be able to help and she can put you in touch with Mgr Artur.
