Door problems

Nothing in our Cathedral is ever simple, and true to form the replacement of the aluminium doors within the Cathedral entrances became a much more complicated job than expected this week. Nobody realised that there were two internal rainwater pipes hidden within the inner door structure for the main entrance. This will all be resolved but it will just take a little more time for the completion of this work. This has meant that work to the two side entrances will get underway this coming week- so I'm afraid there will be further disruption during the daytime within the Cathedral. As well as this as one of the security staff reported on Tuesday morning 'they have shrunk the East Doors' referring to the fact that the gap between the doors on that side was now about 2.5cm which made the centre lock redundant. The edges had been slightly planed to smooth off damage that had been caused in the past but it would take some doing to shrink these doors as a result of cleaning with cotton wool however it will take some protracted adjustments to get this problem resolved. Mind you the original Holy Doors in Rome were not without their problems as they were bricked on both sides(from their first establishment in 1500 to 1950). The knocking down of the doors was a worrisome affair as masons had to make sure that rubble did not reach anywhere near those standing by. Even when the present permanent door was installed in St Peter's in Rome it was not without problems and Blessed Pope Paul 6th was nearly hit by falling cement fragments in 1964 when he opened the year of Jubilee. At least our doors will have been well tested before the start of the Holy Year.

Sir Edwin Lutyens has been described as the United Kingdom's greatest Memorial Architect and last week it was announced that all 44 of his World War One Memorials, ranging from simple stone crosses to elaborate archways and the

cenotaph in Whitehall, have been listed. This will mean in practical terms that they cannot be removed or altered and will be maintained for the long term future. At present our buildings are listed grade 2 star but with the growing interest in the architecture of Lutyens and Gibberd it is likely in the near future that our listing will be raised to the highest grade 1. This serves as a reminder to us all that our buildings are not just important and valued by us locally but also have a growing national significance.

Next Saturday there will be the 'Embrace' event throughout the day at the Cathedral with a variety of youth events and discussions concluding with Mass celebrated by Archbishop McMahon at 4pm. Being the first Catholic Cathedral to be dedicated to Christ the King we celebrate our special Feast next Sunday as we mark the final Sunday in the church year. Looking ahead......There is now a leaflet available in the Cathedral which gives the details of some of the major services and events during the season of Advent and Christmas. As well as this just a reminder that the Holy Year will begin on 6th December with a special Mass and Opening of the Holy Door at 3pm on Sunday 6th December. On that same Sunday, the Feast of St Nicholas, we will be blessing a set of new hangings for the Crypt Chapel on the theme of the Sacraments at 10.00am Family Mass.
