# **First Sunday of Advent**

The First Sunday of Advent heralds the beginning of another church year and with it the sudden urgency to wake up. The readings this week want us to be awake to the presence of the Lord in our lives and looking ahead to when he will come again. It is also a reminder to us here at the Cathedral of the urgency of being ready for the wonderful mixed bag of events that lead up to the Feast of Christmas which will demand all our energy and time each day for the next five weeks or so. As I am typing this newsletter the choir are walking through their paces upstairs in the Cathedral for the Advent Sequence which is at 5pm on Sunday. Meanwhile in Cathedral House someone is attempting announcements using a megaphone and another person banging a gong to imitate the start of the 'news at ten' in preparation for the children's Advent services which take place in a couple of weeks time. Advent may be a peaceful time of waiting for some but it is certainly not the case here.

One of the most challenging issues for the Cathedral at present is to keep a balance between Advent, the start of the Year of Mercy which begins with an Opening Year of Jubilee Mass next Sunday at 3pm and the anticipatory Christmas events. This coming week there is a Christmas Service organised by the SAMM (Support after Murder aroup Manslaughter) on Thursday at 7.30pm. On Friday 4th December our primary school children from St Nicholas will celebrate their Patronal Feast (St Nicholas feast Day falls on Sunday 6th December) with Mass at 1.30pm in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel. The Cathedral Concert Society's Christmas Concert takes place next Saturday evening, I am still worried that the East Cathedral entrance porch will be ready in time for next Sunday when it will be Blessed and opened as the Holy Door for the Jubilee Year. There is still a ceiling to be fitted

and a relighting scheme to be completed – please say a prayer that it is finished in time!

One of the events that all the staff here really enjoy preparing for are the Children's Advent Services, particularly in the alternate years when we are not just the hosts but also responsible for arranging them. This year's extravaganza is no exception and it promises to be an acting and musical spectacle to rival previous years. The final corrections to the script have been made and without giving too much away we have a heavenly news desk this year with roving reporters relating the breaking news of events of universal significance taking place in Bethlehem. We could do with Len, Craig or Bruno along to give some dancing tips for the cast. Children from St Nicholas are playing the parts of the sheep and the donkey with 'Kissy' the dog dressed up as a little lamb and we will even have a live baby a few weeks old taking partas one of the Cathedral Staff, Katie, recently gave birth, a boy that they have named Edmund. Not only have I been given a deadline to complete final lyrics to a song but I have to rehearse Frs Ged and Stephen in handling the motorised Camels, which are decorated disability scooters for the three Kings. These were used for the first time two vears ago and due to the weight of the camel's heads at the front of the vehicles, the clergy were heading off in all different directions, to the great amusement of everyone else but not quite as intended. So if you see either of them driving round on a disability scooter this week, they haven't had an accident, they are in training.
