4th Sunday of Advent

We enter the final few days lead up to our celebrations of Christmas. Just when we are comfortably starting to feel ahead on our preparations for Christmas here at the Cathedral true to form things start to go wrong. We have been waiting all last week for the delivery of a new booklet printer system because one of our machines has developed a fault which can't easily be resolved so we are now behind on all our printing - hence the newsletter this weekend is very last minute. I suppose these little gremlins are a reminder that things didn't go to plan in, human terms, on the first Christmas, not least there was no room at the inn. Nevertheless Christmas will happen whether everything goes according to plan or not - thankfully God's Grace is given freely whether we are ready or not.

At this time of the year there are a whole host of chefs and celebrities giving their tips on how to celebrate Christmas well, ranging from recipes and food for entertaining to decorations and gifts. I'm not sure I have heard anyone giving a few tips on how to how to make the most of the church opportunities over the Christmas Festival. For what it's worth here's my top tips for our Cathedral over the next week or so. Instead of 'Jamie' or 'Nigella' substitute Fr Tony's top tips for a holy Christmas. As we are now in the final run up to Christmas why not come along to the Festival Carol Service at 5.00pm this Sunday. It is a more reflective and prayerful occasion than recent Christmas concerts and yet still has some of the best and most glorious Carols and Christmas Music as well as Christmas Readings and Verse. With a thick outer coat for both warmth and padding for the benches there is no better place than a Cathedral for a service such as this (a handy tip for any of the services that you will attend over the season). For those in the know one of the most meaningful ways to begin to celebrate the Saviour's birth is the First Vespers of Christmas at 3.00pm on Christmas Eve. We sing a few psalms and are like the shepherds waiting on the hillside on the first Christmas, hoping and praying that all people will experience the love and blessings that

the Lord brings at this time. At the end of this choral service we go in procession for the blessing of the Cathedral Crib. gathering the young children together to sing and say a prayer to the infant Jesus born for us all.

There are different readings and prayers for the various Masses for Christmas The 8 00pm Mass at St Vincent's and the later Midnight Celebration at the Cathedral follow the texts for Christmas Midnight, the early morning Masses on Christmas Day that of Christmas Dawn, and for the Solemn High Mass at 11.00am the texts for Christmas Day with the wonderful Prologue of St John proclaimed as the Gospel Reading. With a guaranteed welcome to all there is ample opportunity and invitation to all to come and celebrate the Mass of Christ's Birth and to carry the presence and blessing of the Christ child into their celebrations at home.

This year the Sunday after Christmas, the Feast of the Holy Family, follows on immediately from our celebrations of Christmas Day. There will be no morning Mass or confessions on Boxing Day but there will be the usual Saturday Vigil Masses in the Crypt and at St Vincent's and Masses on the Sunday will be at the normal times.

Please take a Blessed votive light and Christmas Grace prayer card this weekend for you to use at vour table at home for Christmas dinner. Hopefully we will have a Christmas Newsletter printed this coming week with all the information on service times over the holiday period. May the joy and peace of Christ's birth be with us all at this time.
