From the 1st of June to the 1st of September, they distributed 4,709 parcels to those using the emergency food pantries based at St Vincent De Paul and St Bride's Church. They have received great support from regular donors which has enabled them to continue to support the people using the foodbanks but they do expect to see a rise in the need for their services over the next few months. With continual cost of living rises and the uncertainty of fuel prices, they fear that their food aid services will be stretched further than they have ever been before. Micah are working closely with food provision partners across the city and nationally through Feeding Liverpool and the Independent Food Aid Network to try to mitigate these circumstances.
