Bishop Tom Williams

Announcement of the retirement of Bishop Tom Williams from the Office of Auxiliary Bishop of Liverpool

In accordance with Canon Law Bishop Tom Williams submitted his resignation from the Office of Auxiliary Bishop of Liverpool to the Holy Father, Pope Francis, following his 75th birthday.

At 12.00 noon, Rome time today, Saturday 25 March, it was published by the Holy See that the Holy Father Francis accepted the resignation of Bishop Tom Williams from the office of Auxiliary Bishop of Liverpool upon reaching the age of 75 years. Bishop Williams will now be known as Auxiliary Bishop Emeritus.

Commenting on this milestone for Bishop Tom, Archbishop Malcolm McMahon said. '20 years ago to the day, the then Canon Tom Williams of St Anthony of Egypt, Scotland Road was called by Pope St John Paul II to be an auxiliary bishop. Two decades on, we give thanks for so much accomplished and for God's blessing on the years ahead.

'Today is an opportunity for the entire archdiocese to thank God for the long, dedicated ministry of one of its own as deacon, priest, and bishop. Bishop Tom, very much a son of the city of Liverpool, and granted the Freedom of the City recently, is well known and loved by many and has made valuable contributions to the civil and ecclesial life of the city and region. Today marks a point in his ministry when, freed from the administrative burdens of being a vicar general and civil trustee, he can focus more on what he enjoys so much; that is the pastoral ministry of being a priest and bishop. I look forward to his continued help as the Auxiliary Emeritus.'

Bishop Tom said, 'I give thanks for the many blessings of my ministry as Auxiliary Bishop of Liverpool. The happiest days of my life have been spent in Chaplaincy work in hospitals, schools and prisons and I now look forward to focussing on and continuing that pastoral ministry as Auxiliary Bishop Emeritus.'

On this day when his resignation from the office of Auxiliary Bishop is accepted, the family of Liverpool Archdiocese recognises with gratitude and thanksgiving the many ways in which Bishop Williams, apart from his national ministry, has enriched our archdiocesan life, especially through his ministry as a parish priest and service to hospital and school chaplaincies, his work in establishing the clergy healthcare scheme with Monsignor Michael McKenna and his long service over many years to the archdiocesan finance committee and the George Andrew Fund.

All are welcome from the parishes, schools. and hospitals of the Archdiocese to join in prayer at a Mass of Thanksgiving for Bishop Tom Williams' 20 years of episcopal ministry here in Liverpool as an auxiliary Bishop.
