

CHRISTOPHER SYMONS 1931-2025, Cathedral Master of the Music 1960 - 1966

Christopher Symons was, at the age

of 29, appointed to be the first Master of Music at Cathedral. The Lutvens Crypt had been completed and opened only a short time, and Canon Edward Murphy (Diocesan Director of Music) was running a choir, mainly of students, to sing a plainsong mass each Sunday. Christopher's task was to found and train a choir of men and boys, the boys to be educated at the newly acquired choir school, The Gables. The choir sang for the first time on the Feast of Christ the King 1960, and under Christopher's direction, it developed its technique and its repertoire over next years. Christopher resigned from his post in 1966, shortly before the opening of the new cathedral - at which ceremony several of his compositions were sung - and he returned to teaching. including a spell in various schools in Scotland and in Canada. As older age and illness took its toll. Christopher and his wife Sue moved into a care home in Somerset, but shortly after moving there Sue sadly died. Christopher felt her loss greatly, and his own health gradually deteriorated, until he died, peacefully, sitting in his room, just last week aged 94. His funeral is at Haycombe Crematorium, Bath, 24 February, 1.00pm. May he rest in peace.
