Good Shepherd Sunday

Today is Good Shepherd Sunday and is a special time of prayer for vocations and particularly to vocations to the priesthood and religious life. The image of the Good Shepherd was a powerful representation of Christ for the early Church. Similar to a shepherd who cares for and guides his flock, Jesus proclaims in the Gospel of John that He is the Good Shepherd who lays down Jos life for his sheep. Motivated by love and moved with compassion He provides divine protection and leadership for His Church and His people as He leads us to eternal life.

As Peter, after he was appointed the principle shepherd, had his brother apostles to help and support him so our new Pope will need the assistance of Bishops and priests to support him and serve our network of Catholic communities around the world. Perhaps more than ever we need good shepherds to be coworkers with the successors of the apostles to help guide, protect and provide for the sheep following the example Christ gave.

As Pilgrims of Hope today we recognise the important role of priests and religious within our communities. We need them and so today we are asked to pray for them in a special and specific way. To pray for those who have answered God's call, those discerning it and those who are yet to hear that gentle prompting of the Holy Spirit in the depths of their hearts.

After the four priestly ordinations last summer, we have six seminarians in formation for the diocesan priesthood and a number of men in the discernment group or in one-to-one discussions with the Vocation Director. They come from across the Archdiocese, are of various ages and backgrounds reflecting the Lord's call of ordinary men who by God's grace are able to respond and offer themselves to live a life of service to the Church and God's people. JUBILEE PILGRIMAGE WALK


