Cathedral News

ANTHEA JARVIS RIP

Anthea was born in 1942 and married to Adrian who was also a museum curator. She had two children, Emily and Frank. Originally from Somerset, she studied at Birmingham University and was the first costume mistress when the Everyman Theatre opened in 1964. Later, a Curator of Liverpool Museum and Manchester Museums where she oversaw the Gallery of English Costume before retiring. Her two books: *Liverpool Fashion Makers & Weavers* and *Wedding Clothes & Customs* were written in 1981 and 1983. She herself was also a fine artist.

Anthea's first contacts with the Metropolitan Cathedral were in 1983 when son Frank became a chorister and after he left the choir his mother remained a very loyal supporter as a member of the Choir Association. Before long she had become the editor of the choir newsletter *Choral Whispers* and went on several choir tours including those to Rome and Cologne as an adult chaperone.

For very many years she was a Cathedral reader, well known for her excellent diction and expressive readings. The former Dean, Mgr Provost Peter Cookson, invited her to join a small working group to set up the Cathedral Treasury in the Lutyens Crypt. Her knowledge and skills in dealing with fabrics were vital in seeing that the various vestments on show were hung properly.

Anthea worked as a volunteer with the former Diocesan Archivist Dr Meg Whittle and later with the current Archivist, Neil Sayer. She spent many afternoons working through the parish

records and other matters, very particular in seeing that records were correct in every detail. When the Cathedral's Art & Design Advisory Group was set up in 2018 to advise the Dean on such matters, Anthea was a founder member until her untimely death.

Diocesan-wise she was a valued member of the Art & Architecture Department since the 70s and her knowledge and appreciation of artworks was most informative.

Anthea will be greatly missed from the cathedral community. May she rest in peace.

CAFOD – RESPONSE IN GAZA
